SHALOM, B'NAI TIKVAH!

The festival of Shavuot begins at sundown on Saturday evening June 8. (We'll be celebrating with "The Jewish Night of Why" ... please see p. 6 for more information). Shavuot itself is a beautiful holiday: at once a harvest

festival and the Season of Revelation hearkening back to the Israelites first hearing the words of our ancient covenant at Mt. Sinai. After seven weeks of Counting the Omer and, step by step, coming closer to this moment, we find that in the words of a past student of mine: "The view is spectacular."

Adding to the wonder of Shavuot is the traditional reading of the Scroll of Ruth, which tells the story of a young Moabite woman who, from her painful past, helps to fashion a hopeful future for her newfound family. Central to the narrative is Ruth's choice to become part of the Jewish people, a choice rooted in her love of and devotion to her mother-in-law Naomi. In this way, Ruth's story is also one of revelation, demonstrating to us all these years later, just how powerful relationships are, and just how much potential they have to infuse our lives with lasting meaning.

The coming Shavuot is particularly special to me for another reason: it will be my final one here at CBT. As I reflect on the past five years of serving as your rabbi, I realize that Ruth and Naomi, my greatest source of joy and fulfillment has been the building of relationships we have undertaken together. It is you – the members of this remarkable community – who have made me a better rabbi. That's a gift I will carry with me to my next congregation in Edison, and always.

I look forward to seeing you at Shir Joy on Friday, June 21 at 7:30 pm, at which time I will have the opportunity to share further words of thanks and blessing with you.

Here's to the continued unfolding of a beautiful spring, and a bountiful harvest to come.

REFLECTIONS...

Many of you know that every summer, I spend 5 days deeply immersed in Talmud study at a place called Queer Talmud Camp. These five days are some of the most fun, provocative, rich and rewarding days of my entire year, because of the intensity of the study and the unique

people who come to learn together each summer. I have studied a lot of Talmud in my life, and it was only during my first summer at camp that I truly began to understand the purpose and power of Talmud study, by learning through the lens of the LGBTQ community. As you all know, I am happily married to a man in a heterosexual relationship, so you might wonder why I would be drawn to learn in this way. There are many reasons, among them that I am a nerd and this is camp is Talmud-nerd heaven! But much more importantly, one of the reasons I return every year is that I get a glimpse of what it is like to be in the minority within a surrounding majority culture, which is something I almost never experience in my life. If you are part of the majority, no matter how open-hearted or kind you are to the "others" who walk through your doors, you cannot begin to comprehend the complexity of their experience of the world. I am not making any claims on understanding the experience of an LGBTQ person by going to camp for 5 days, but I do feel like every year, I get a tiny bit closer to internalizing just how significant it is for them to live and work every day in a heteronormative culture; and, the Talmud learning is extraordinary.

I have learned so much about this topic from our beloved Lisa Zeiler, who has been playing guitar and leading music on our bima for many years now. When she first came to CBT, she certainly didn't expect to stay for years, since she didn't know what kind of community she would find here in the suburbs. But she will be the first one to tell you how surprised she is that she feels so comfortable here, despite being decidedly in the minority. I imagine that many of our wonderful congregants never think about what it's like for her or other LGBTQ people to walk through our doors, but because of Lisa and Queer Talmud Camp, now I do. And I want us all to hear more.

So, in the spirit of loving curiosity and with the desire for our world to be radically inclusive, please join us on Friday, June 14th at 6:30 for our Pride Shabbat! Lisa will be our guest speaker. We will hear about her experience of navigating life as a lesbian in a straight world, about the complexities of gender today, and about steps we can take to be more welcoming to people of all minorities who want to pray with us at CBT.

At Congregation B'nai Tikvah, we believe that a kind and vibrant Jewish community deepens and restores our sense of purpose and connection to the world. We are dedicated to learning, music-infused prayer, personal relationships and a commitment to social justice, and welcome all who are looking to explore the many innovative paths to meaning that Judaism has to offer.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm so hopeful that this role will be a fulfilling one for her and allow her to be closer to family as her son Jonah grows up. 

2019 MEMBER SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

It our pleasure to present select highlights from the 2019 B'nai Tikvah Member Survey conducted online between the 14th and 24th of May. These results reflect data from 126 respondents, representing 42% of our member households.

62% of respondents attend a service, program or event at CBT at least once month.

98% of respondents regularly read Tikvah Talk 53% of whom would prefer to read it in color online.

Starting with the August issue, we are launching an opt-out option if you prefer to no longer receive a paper copy in the mail. The 53% of respondents who indicated this preference in this survey will be automatically opted-out; to opt-out or opt-back-in at any time, please contact the office.

88% of respondents said the amount of emails from B'nai Tikvah is "just right."

Only 32% of respondents follow B'nai Tikvah on Facebook.


When asked about Security at CBT:
