REFLECTIONS...



By Rabbi Jennie Chabon Dear friends,

A few weeks ago, as our beautiful Nishma service in celebration of Shabbat Shira came to a close, we heard the news of the hostage situation in Colleyville, Texas, and the

illusion of our safety came crashing down around us. I did not spend even one minute of our service feeling unsafe, partly because we have guards at CBT on Shabbat (and at religious school) and partly because there is only so much uncertainty a person can hold at once. With Omicron raging, our focus leading up to Shabbat Shira had been on decisions around the health of our community in relation to the virus, not on the fear of someone with hateful intentions entering our sacred sanctuary on Shabbat.

Now that the crisis in Texas is over, it would be easy to think that we can put it behind us. Thank God, we say! It hardly ever ends like that, with all of the hostages safe and unharmed at the end of a long and harrowing day; thank God indeed.

Baruch Atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech Ha'olam, matir asurim

Blessed are you, God, Eternal Spirit of the World, who frees the captive

But just because the worst part is over does not mean we aren't still provoked and traumatized by the experience. We can try to tuck it away, give thanks that it's over and move on; take a deep breath and turn to the next thing on our agenda. But after two years of an unpredictable pandemic, where every wave of hope is shattered by the emergence of a new variant, we should know better than to think it's as simple as turning the page to a bright new shiny chapter. We are a worldwide community of traumatized people, and in our little Jewish world, that is acutely true today.

So how do we help each other hold all of the fear and grief and uncertainty? How do we find our grounding in what poet John O'Donohue calls the interim time,

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Do you remember Stanley Kubrick's, Dr. Strangelove? It's a 1964 black comedy with Peter Sellers, Slim Pickens, and others that satirizes the nuclear tensions between the United States and the Soviet Union. The subtitle of the film is:

How I learned to stop worrying and love the bomb.

In today's world, I'm not saying I've learned to love the uncertainty that Covid has caused, but I have stopped worrying about it, and I'm learning to live with it.

Unfortunately, it appears that Covid will not disappear for a long time, if ever. It also appears that we cannot live in perpetual lockdown or fear. However, we have an arsenal of tools to help mitigate any serious consequences of the disease.

We can vaccinate. We can booster. We can mask. We can avoid indoor crowds with people who are not vaccinated and masked. We can take reasonable precautions that allow us to be reasonably safe. And we can be reasonably assured that our friends and neighbors are behaving similarly which will allow us to be reasonably comfortable with the discomfort living with Covid is causing.

Rabbi Chabon, Keren, the Covid Response Team, and I have established what we think are reasonable protocols to keep CBT functioning reasonably well during these unreasonable times. We have also communicated these protocols to our community in our regular email blasts and, when an important change occurs, in a stand-alone email. We are not going to make everyone happy. Some of us want stricter rules in place. Some of us want CBT to loosen up. Some of us would rather not participate in services or events in person. Some of us are ready to do so if we are all masked and fully vaccinated. Some parents of our religious school children want in-person, indoor classes. Some want us to remain virtual.

As my grandmother used to say, "Oy Gevalt!"

So, the challenge we face as members of the CBT family is how do we remain a close and connected family when we have different comfort levels

L'chaim – To Life

There is something magical about numbers and the way they play in our lives. I don't say that just as the daughter of a mathematician enamored with how the world is governed by numbers, but also as someone who loves to look at patterns and hidden meanings. I have always

been fascinated by gematria, the mystical way of uncovering meanings and connections between Hebrew words, based on their numerical value. In Hebrew, each letter in the alphabet is assigned a number, with the most famous value being the word for life, 'n(chai), which equals 18.

This year's Gala, on May 22 – MARK YOUR CALENDARS – is dedicated to life.

In the special way in which numbers work, they sometimes seem like they have a providence, and this year for our community this is manifested in the centrality of chai. At this moment in time, we are celebrating chai on two levels. First, this year marks Rabbi Chabon's eighteenth year of her graceful leadership of our community. Second, as we are (slowly and not so surely) coming out of Covid, we are ready to embrace life again. I look forward to this beautiful day in May when we all will get dressed up, come together to celebrate our community, and enjoy a fun and vibrant evening.

I first came to know Rabbi Chabon back when she was Cantor Chabon, when I was invited to a Bat Mitzvah at CBT years before I started working here. Her voice captivated me, so much so that I didn't notice the service flying by. At that point in my life, I strongly identified as an Israeli who doesn't like to sit through services. Being engrossed in a service and moved spiritually was a new feeling for me. The second time I met Rabbi was in my interview process nearly six years ago, when I was sitting in her office (now my own). I was struck by how magnetic she is even one-on-one and how she drew me in and disarmed me in this interview. I am sure that many of you have had similar experiences, where you get lost in time listening to Rabbi's angelic voice and words of wisdom, whether from the Bimah or privately. For many of us, Rabbi Chabon is what drew us to CBT and the person who lifts our spirits up and guides us through our complex lives.

What is personally so gratifying to me is that I get to co-lead this gala in honor of Rabbi Chabon. My co-lead, Rachel Stokol, grew up in this community, served as the Head Tutor and Head Madricha in our religious school, taught fourth grade as a remote UCLA student during Covid, and now works remotely as our communications specialist and superhero. I look forward to planning a special day for our community and dedicating this year's gala to honoring one of the most special humans in my life, a woman who I am happy to call my work partner and dear friend, our beloved spiritual leader — Rabbi Jennie Chabon

where, 'Everyone has lost sight of your heart/And you can see nowhere to put your trust'? Where is God in the interim place, when we still don't know how the story will end?

This, my friends, is what the mystics call a faith experience. It is easy to have faith when life feels secure and full of joy, when the story has a happy ending, but turning to an invisible God when you have nothing to hold onto, when nothing feels certain or sure? That is faith, the desire to turn to God within the mess and uncertainty of life. That is precisely the challenge of this endless interim time. It may seem almost impossible, or even foolish, but the reassuring news is that only good can come of turning to faith right now. We cannot change the unpredictable nature of the world, but we can lay claim with all of our might to our hearts and minds, and that, O'Donohue tells us, is where real transformation happens:

What is being transfigured here is your mind, And it is difficult and slow to become new. The more faithfully you can endure here, The more refined your heart will become For your arrival in the new dawn.

Hold strong, my beloveds. Turn to one another, to your Jewish community, to God. Not because we will find secure footing beneath us but because together, as we lift our hands in surrender, we just might learn to fly.

Back Again

On January 9th, I came into Religious School as the acting Director of Education after what felt like a long time away. We have made a few changes in the school to enhance our program. Third grade, our biggest class, now has two teachers who will lead the class for the rest of the year. I am confident that our kids are in the best hands and that they will have a fantastic end of their seventh-grade year.

I am looking forward to an excellent experience with your children and your families during the remainder of the school year. I've decided that because I trust our family members, I will take what I consider the minor and manageable risk of meeting in person with our community at services, at events, individually or in groups. I've also decided that other CBT family members are more risk-averse than I. Therefore, rather than ignore or deride their Covid avoidance measures, I will accommodate them because I want them to remain engaged in our community. Therefore, CBT will continue to provide programming, both religious and social, that will have avenues for participation for those of us who are not ready to gather.

I know that Covid has tested our resilience. I firmly and truly believe that we have negotiated the uncertain terrain that the pandemic created with fortitude and grace. We will continue to do so. But we must not give up and walk away. We thrive as a community only when we all feel a part of the community and when we respect each other's comfort level. I am sure we can continue to do so.


