REFLECTIONS...

A few weeks ago, I got an email from a congregant requesting a meeting with me. He explained that he and his wife had injured CRT relatively recently, and while

He explained that he and his wife had joined CBT relatively recently, and while she had found her home with us, he was still struggling to find his place, and his

comfort with our community depended on the two of us having a conversation. He had heard me say something at services that did not sit well with him, so he reached out to talk to me about it. We had never spoken face to face before, and I really appreciated this opportunity to get to know him.

I loved so many things about his email and about our following conversation. I always enjoy it when congregants reach out to me, whether it is because they are in need of spiritual counseling, they want to get to know me better, or they want to discuss something that is bothering them. Our entire community structure depends on people feeling safe and heard by their rabbi and by our synagogue leadership, and that is most often accomplished in personal, intimate conversations.

When he came to meet with me, we sat in my office and had a beautiful, honest conversation in which we both learned a lot about each other. For many of us, these types of conversations are challenging and can feel confrontational. Many people might feel nervous about meeting with the rabbi to share something difficult, especially if we have never spoken before. But this man chose candor and a desire for connection over fear or apprehension. He also chose to speak to me, instead of harboring these feelings and allowing them to fester. What resulted was the beginning of a new sacred relationship, and his desire to stay in our community. Indeed, it is often in the uncomfortable moments that we plant the seeds of transformation.

I share this story because in our community, we have just one rabbi—that would be me!—serving three hundred families. I want to know each one of you, our members: know your stories, your personalities, your smiles, and be that person you can always talk to about whatever is on your heart. This is easiest to do with the people I see most often: our Shabbat regulars, our choir members, our Torah study aficionados, the kids in our school on Sunday mornings and our b'nai mitzvah students,

CONNECTION CORNER

Judaism is designed to ground us in gratitude, to start each day with the glass half full, reciting the *Modeh Ani*, and remembering that life is a gift. When I take the time to reflect, I know how incredibly fortunate I am to wake up each day in a

healthy body, with a wonderful family, surrounded by people I enjoy and love, and work for a community that I believe in. And yet, we live in a world surrounded by a glass half-empty mentality and highlighted by a myriad of things that are broken and need fixing, and I often find that I forget the good.

I want to share a recent experience that left me not only thankful for what we have created together but settled me in a new confidence about our future: getting to know the next generation of our community leaders — we are doing something right.

A year ago I came back from the annual NATA (National Association of Temple Administrators) conference, fired up with all sorts of thoughts and ideas that were either presented or inspired by this time with my colleagues. One of these ideas was a Junior Board, an opportunity for our teens to engage as leaders in the community. This idea came after an incredibly fascinating lecture about how different generations interact with organized religion. I learned that Gen Z, the generation of our teens, has the potential to become active members as their interest in the world aligns with being part of a strong community. I wanted to create a program that engages our future leaders, gives them the tools and the skills needed to become Jewish leaders, and teaches us more about how they like to engage with temple life so we can make sure to provide it.

We received a generous grant from the East Bay JCC for two teen leadership programs, one of which is the Junior Board. I recruited an adult partner in championing this program, general board member Amy Lerner, and together we launched the Junior Board. We intentionally put very few parameters around the design of the board, just enough to give it shape, but otherwise allowing room to empower our teens in making the board their own. The definition we gave the Junior Board is its name, the age range of 6th -12th grade, and that it makes recommendations to the General Board about any CBT topic, rather than being a

Friends,

When I spoke to you on Yom Kippur, I highlighted the difference between the past two years during which Covid forced us to experience our High Holiday Services on screen to the awe, beauty, and personal connection we experienced this

year because we were able to gather in community to share our holidays in person. I know that I felt a much stronger spirit of our community and its emotional presence this year than I felt viewing rather than participating in the services while observing them at home.

Well, our Shabbat services offer us the same opportunity. I know it's more convenient to sit at home, power up your computer, and observe the services. I know it's dark and cold at night. I know that you can keep your WFH sweats or PJ's on rather than putting on "real" clothes. But I know and you know too that it is not the same.

So, I am going to repeat what I asked on Yom Kippur, that we all lean into what CBT has to offer.

Maybe that means attending one Shabbat service a month. Maybe Shir Joy with its beautiful music and interesting and changing melodies. Maybe the Friday themed services. Read our calendar. Although our Shabbat services are enjoyable (thank you Rabbi Chabon) they are not entertainment. We all, including CBT as an institution, benefit from congregational participation.

And we all benefit from the onegs. We eat, schmooze, communicate, talk to each other, talk to Rabbi Chabon, make new friends, stay in touch with old friends – in other words grow closer and stronger as a community.

CBT is more than place to worship. We are a strong vibrant community. We offer both social and educational experiences that are rich and fun. Think of the Social Action Committee's advocacy for racial, immigrant, and climate justice, and its support of deserving charitable organizations serving marginalized and needy communities. 

Social Action - More than just a committee at CBT

The Social Action Committee (SAC) is alive and well at B'nai Tikvah! We are currently 23 members strong. We always welcome additional members, new ideas, and those who might not want to become a member but DO want to join us for an occasional activity or event.

Our ongoing work supports a range of local service organizations. These include assisting with settling immigrants and refugees with The Interfaith Movement for Human Integrity (IFMHI) and the Jewish Family and Children's Services (JFCS); and supporting the Monument Crisis Center (MCC) with food, diapers, school backpacks and finances. Your generous donations to our committee allow us to send monetary support to local nonprofits which include White Pony, Hope Solutions, Culinary Angels, MCC, JFCS and IFMHI.

As CBT is a member of the Union for Reform Judaism, the SAC is active in the Religious Action Center of URJ. This group works to educate, inspire, and mobilize the Reform Jewish Movement to advocate for social justice. The CA state branch has been working on Climate Justice this year and the national group has continued its focus on Civil and Voting Rights. The SAC attempts to share relevant information with the congregation as well as opportunities to take individual action on specific issues.

The SAC is also tasked with greening our synagogue and we currently have a sub-committee working on how to best accomplish the next phase of this ongoing project.

We've also provided opportunities for congregants who aren't members of the committee to act on issues which might feel particularly important to you as individuals. We've sent a group, with CBT banner held high, to a local march for women's reproductive rights; organized folks assisting with food collection for Walnut Creek's Day of Service; held a local blood drive at CBT, and held a post-carding party (via National Council of Jewish Women) to thank independent women's reproductive providers nation-wide for their care for patients.

We've also partnered with other CBT committees and groups in collaborative efforts. Two of these events are coming up in December. We're working with the Interfaith Council of Contra Costa on the Food for Thought program packing food for needy children for the winter break, and we'll be assisting Sisterhood with their upcoming holiday project for JFCS, making hygiene kits for refugees. Please consider joining us for one or both of these activities!

We're thankful for our office staff, board, and clergy for their ongoing support. And we're especially grateful for you, the members of CBT, who generously donate the funds which allow us to contribute so much to our community.

Please consider joining us on the third Sunday of the month for a one hour Zoom meeting. We welcome religious school parents interested in helping to create programs for families so they can experience the joy and teachings of Tikkun Olam. We hope to be a conduit for fulfilling your own desire for repairing the world.




